Required documents

The required documents for an Australian work visa depend on the specific visa type, as there are various work visas available. Generally, here are the common documents needed:

- 1. Passport:** A valid passport with a minimum of six months' validity.
- 2. Visa Application Form:** Completed and signed application form for the specific work visa subclass.
- 3. Photographs:** Recent passport-sized photographs as per Australian immigration specifications.
- 4. Proof of English Proficiency:** Results from an English test (e.g., IELTS, TOEFL, PTE) to demonstrate language skills if required.
- 5. Skills Assessment:** Evidence of qualifications and experience relevant to the job, often assessed by a recognized authority in Australia for your profession.
- 6. Job Offer or Employment Contract:** A letter of offer, employment contract, or sponsorship by an

Australian employer if applying for a sponsored visa (e.g., Temporary Skill Shortage Visa - subclass 482).

7. Health Insurance: Proof of health insurance that covers your stay in Australia, which may be required for some temporary visas.

8. Health and Character Checks: Medical examination results and police clearance certificates from your home country (and any other country where you've lived for a year or more in the past 10 years).

9. Financial Proof: Bank statements or other evidence to show you have sufficient funds to support yourself in Australia.

10. Relationship Documents: If applying with family, documents proving the relationship, like marriage or birth certificates.

11. Resume/CV: Updated resume detailing your work experience and qualifications.

12. Professional Registrations or Licenses: For certain occupations, such as healthcare, you may need proof of registration or licensing in Australia.

NOTE

The amount of financial proof required varies depending on the type of work visa and your personal circumstances. While there's no strict minimum amount specified for all work visas, the Department of Home Affairs typically expects applicants to show they can support themselves and any dependents for at least the initial period of their stay (3 months).

For most work visas, having enough funds to cover the following is advisable:

Living Expenses: AUD \$20,000 per year, depending on your lifestyle and location in Australia. Larger cities like Sydney and Melbourne may require a higher budget for accommodation and daily expenses.

Dependents: If you're bringing family members, you should demonstrate additional funds to cover their living expenses as well.

Flight Costs: Enough to cover the cost of a return flight to your home country.

Accommodation: Proof of ability to pay for rent or housing costs upon arrival in Australia.

Health Insurance: This can vary widely depending on your age, length of stay, and health needs.

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For certain work visas, employers may also provide sponsorship, which can cover some or all of your living expenses. It's a good idea to have bank statements or other financial records showing access to these funds, typically for at least the previous three months, to demonstrate you're financially prepared.
